	<p>Discover how Lehigh Valley Patriots worked together during the Revolutionary War to save the Liberty Bell from the British. Explore a real Conestoga Wagon and tour our all-new Revolutionary War Exhibit Gallery. Experience interactive activities in STEAM, ELA, and Social Studies. Combines well with “Colonial & Revolutionary Child’s Life” tour at Trout Hall (see below).</p>		
<u>Native Americans & Archaeology of PA</u>	All Grades	1 Hr.	Year-Round
<p>Explore Pennsylvania Indians from the Paleo era to the arrival of European settlers as you view 200+ authentic artifacts. Learn about Native American culture, lifestyles, food, and tools through engaging interactive activities including a simulated archaeological dig.</p>

	All Grades	1 Hr.	Sept.-Oct. May-June
	<p><i>Step into colonial America</i> at the mansion built by James Allen, son of Allentown’s founder. Students practice colonial manners or write with a quill pen. Grades K-3 explore daily life. Grades 4 up also learn about Patriots and Loyalists during the Revolutionary War. Combines well with “Ring out Liberty” tour at the Lehigh Valley Heritage Museum (above).</p>

<p><u>Pennsylvania Dutch Farm Life</u> Historic 1756 Troxell-Steckel Farm, Whitehall</p>	All Grades	See below	See below
<p>• Regular Tours: Available Sept.-Oct. & May-June <i>Experience life on an 1842 Pennsylvania Dutch farm</i> as you try using a butter churn, farm tools, and much more. Tours last 1¼ hours.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-between;"> <div style="width: 70%;"> <p>• Holiday Tours: Available ONLY Dec. 10 – 12, 9:30, 11:00, & 1:00 <i>Costumed guides portraying members of the farm family from 1842 teach about Pennsylvania Dutch holiday customs</i> of that era. Hear holiday tales, decorate a tree, play with old-fashioned toys, and learn about period cooking. Tours last 1 hour. This tour is not designed or structured to promote or inhibit any culture or religion over another. Nor is it designed to have students participate in a holiday celebration. <p><u>Farmers, Flour Mills & Folk Tales</u> Historic ca. 1850 Haines Mill, Cetrionia</p>	All Grades	1 Hr.	Sept-Oct. & May-June
<div style="display: flex; align-items: flex-start;">  <p>• Students Grades K-3: The Little Red Hen Students <i>practice ELA skills</i> and develop their understanding of <i>economics</i> as they <i>experience the story of “The Little Red Hen”</i> first-hand, handling old-fashioned farm tools, touring the flour mill, and grinding wheat.</p> <p>• Students Grades 3 & up: Miller’s Math & Science Your tour takes you back to the 1920s, introducing you to the miller’s son, Wilbur Haines. <i>Includes STEM</i> concepts as students tour the mill’s simple machines & grind wheat.</p> </div>			
<p><u>Industrial Revolution Ironworker</u> Historic 1868 Lock Ridge Iron Furnace, Alburtis</p>	All Grades	1¼ Hr.	Sept-Oct. & May-June
<p>Twelve-hour shifts, hot dangerous work, and company houses tell <i>the story of the Industrial Revolution</i>. Take on the role of a 1910 ironworker as you tour the grounds of an iron furnace and company town from another era.
